ORDER

On September 8, 2016, the Court ordered the defendant Julie Mayo ("Mayo") to comply with its previous orders to provide information on her business partner Shelly LaRocca and the source of her counterfeit goods. (Docket #120 at 2-3). The Court further requested that the plaintiff submit a report on Mayo's compliance (or lack thereof) within twenty-one days. *Id.* at 3.

On September 26, 2016, the plaintiff submitted the requested report, stating that Mayo had not complied. (Docket #122). The plaintiff does not seek Mayo's civil contempt at this time, as the Court suggested may be appropriate. *Id.* Instead, the plaintiff desires that the Court reimpose the permanent injunction it issued on October 16, 2014. (Docket #17). The Court notes, however, that although most of the October 16, 2014 default judgment order was vacated on July 24, 2015, the permanent injunction was left in place. (Docket #46 at ¶ 1). In fact, the parties stipulated to the October 16, 2014 order of injunction becoming a final judgment of injunction. *Id.* at ¶ 4.

Thus, the injunction remains in effect as of today's date and going forward in perpetuity. In particular, the injunction is unaffected by Mayo's personal bankruptcy. *See Dominic's Restaurant of Dayton, Inc. V. Mantia*, 683 F.3d 757, 760-61 (6th Cir. 2012) (explaining logic of permitting injunctive Case 2:14-cv-00654-JPS Filed 09/30/16 Page 1 of 2 Document 123 relief on matters arguably related to the bankruptcy, in the context trademark infringement). Having granted the plaintiff all of its requested relief against each of the defendants, this matter will be dismissed without prejudice.

Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED that this action be and the same is hereby DISMISSED without prejudice.

The Clerk of the Court is directed to enter judgment accordingly.
